We also want to thank those churches and individuals for their extra monetary gifts during the month of December. They were a real help and blessing to our family and we feel humbled to know that you thought of us during the holidays. Thank you!

Before closing, we would like to let everyone know that we now know the gender of the upcoming addition to the Pizzo household. We are having a boy! We do covet your continued prayers for Anna and the baby. Thankfully, the pregnancy has gone well but, as the due date draws closer (March 1<sup>st</sup>), traveling to long-distance meetings is not as feasible. For now, we are back in Pensacola, FL and will be based here for the next several months. I am still going to our scheduled meetings but some of them will be without the rest of my family. Thank you for all your prayers and support throughout 2019! We are looking forward to what the Lord will do in 2020. "Even so, come, Lord Jesus"!
